The town of Mocuba is near the Takwane heartland and is where the dedication ceremony will be held on July 1<sup>st</sup>. We are thankful to the people of the Evangelical Church in Mocuba who have received this precious cargo and who will keep it for us until we arrive there in June. Rejoice with us in the safe arrival of the Bibles.

Peg continues to check two translations from Brazil. She is working hard on the Gospel of Luke in the Pacaas Novos language ahead of her trip there in March. Pray that the Lord will give her eyes to see what she needs to see, and wisdom in knowing how to counsel the team.

She will now receive four weekly shots of Procrit, a hormone that should stimulate the bone marrow to make more red blood cells. Thanks for praying for wisdom for the doctor. Jeff, along with several others, is still working on an on-line certification course for beginning users of the translation software Paratext. The curriculum for the first course is mostly written. The team is getting input from users about what is the right level of material for new translators. The team members have made a few "proof-of-concept" online modules and are getting the hang of how to design and implement e-learning. Please pray for Jeff and the team to define what the beginner needs to know so that the course will be helpful without being overwhelming.
